**The Kingdom of Heaven Is Like...  
Understanding Faith Through the  
Parables**

**A Thing Is Worth Just What It Costs  
Luke 19:11-27**

The parable of the pounds (the Lucan version of the more familiar Parable of the Talents) is one of my favorite parables. In Luke's story, Jesus tells about a king who leaves some servants behind as he goes to have his kingdom conferred. The servants are to invest his money while he is gone. The situation is somewhat tense because a delegation of citizens follows the king urging that his authority be taken away.

You know the story—the king returns and most of the servants have good news about their investments. One servant, however, has merely hidden the money and returns it to the king. Far from being satisfied with this, the king is livid and punishes the servant.

This story is about more than just how we use the talents or abilities God has given us—this story is about what we are willing to risk for God.

Join us Sunday as we learn that a thing is worth just what it costs.



## Desire

While I have been off the past couple of weeks, Sandi and I have been re-reading one of our favorite books by John Eldredge, *The Journey of Desire*. Of all of Eldredge's books, this one speaks probably most deeply to me.

The idea of the book is basically this: desire is a good thing. There are, to be sure, corrupt desires. But, the fact that human beings have a sense that something more could be here in life that is not here, or not here yet, is basic to our humanity. All of us as human beings have a sense that life could be better—we hope there is more to life than we have experienced so far. Desire makes us restless and pushes us to search.

Of course, we may try to fulfill our desires the wrong way. Some of us try to kill desire with our addictions, hoping that temporary pleasure will make the yearning go away. Others may try to use work or TV or games to deaden desire. Some of us keep thinking the perfect relationship or the perfect job or the perfect church will finally satisfy that desire—and we keep trying relationship after relationship or job after job thinking the next one will make us happy.

Some religions (Buddhism comes to mind) try to get rid of desire thinking that desire is the problem in life. But, desire tells us that something is possible beyond what we have or even what we can make happen in life.

The apostle Paul tells us that yearning is built into creation itself for God's purpose:

*Romans 8:19-21 (MsgB)*


*The created world itself can hardly wait for what's coming next. Everything in creation is being more or less held back. God reins it in until both creation and all the creatures are ready and can be released at the same moment into the glorious times ahead. Meanwhile, the joyful anticipation deepens.*

The fact that we want more tells us the possibility for more exists. And when we finally let go of all our solutions to get more and turn to God, we will find that the great fulfiller of desire loves us and wants to satisfy our hearts.

The worst thing in life is not to be unfulfilled, but not to want anything at all. As long as we have desire, we have the possibility of allowing God's grace to fill our lives.

## A Parent's Most Needed Answers

**What is Bible Biz?** Bible Biz is an inductive Bible study course that goes through an entire book of the Bible verse by verse. Through the *NIV Study Bible* and personal devotional, the student is able to learn how to use his/her own Bible for study. They will learn how to use the concordance, maps, charts, and commentaries included in the Bible. Bible Biz teaches the student how to study the word.

**Exactly what age would benefit from the Bible Biz program?** Bible Biz is a program designed for 5<sup>th</sup> grade through high school. It can then be divided up by lessons and quizzes to make it more age appropriate (5<sup>th</sup>- 6<sup>th</sup> graders, 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> separated into groups).

**What book of the Bible is currently being studied?** The book of Matthew will be the study for the next two years.

**What is the calendar set up for Bible Biz?** Bible Biz is utilized within the school calendar, from September through the end of April. At FUMC it follows the Wednesday Night schedule from 5:15 pm to 6:30 pm. A dinner of pizza, pop and brownies is available for \$2.00 during Biz.

**Does Bible Biz have extensive memory and questions to learn each week?** Bible Biz is designed to include the students at both extremes. It will teach the student that does no weekly Bible study or the student that dives in each day to God's word. No student will feel behind or excluded because they did not do their devotional through the week. Memory is optional for Bible Biz. There is a set memory schedule programmed into the weekly devotionals for those students who want that challenge

**Does this program exclude those that don't study and don't do memory?** No, No, No. This answer is repeated to emphasize that Bible Biz is designed to meet the needs of the church for all young people—those that have discipline and those that are learning. This course of study does not exclude those that are just beginning to ruminate in God's word. Through the weekly lessons and videos, the student begins to place line upon line and precept upon precept.

**How can I learn more about Biz?** Come to Bible Biz on Wednesday, August 27 at 5:15 pm in MSLC 231.

**How much parent involvement does Bible Biz take?** A parent of a Bizzer is asked to come ONCE a semester to help with Biz—yes, you read it right—just one entire Biz per semester.
